- Find the price of ten items in your weekly food shop, calculate the total cost.





Art: Create an elephant using recycled material! (See photographs below) You will need: an old milk carton, scissors, glue, paint and/or coloured or crepe paper.

- 1. Remove the lid and thoroughly clean your milk carton.
- 2. Always ask an adult for help when using scissors. Cut across the bottom of the carton and remove it. Next, cut off the bottom of the handle (trunk). Following that, cut out pieces on the bottom of the carton (square shapes) to create the shape of the elephant's legs.
- 3. Your elephant should stand independently. Now for some colour!
- 4. If you have glue and coloured paper / crepe paper, tear the paper into small pieces. Glue the paper onto the milk carton to create a bright and colourful elephant. If you don't have coloured paper / crepe paper, you could paint the carton instead.
- 5. Add eyes and ears using paint or paper and glue.



Draw and colour a sunset or sunrise.
